A Look Back at Our Last Meetings:


April 10^{th -} Megan Heyl - Operation Spring Cleaning: Organizing Your Stuff

Website-FaceBook-Plus

As of June 22, 2024, there are 356 members in our Facebook group.

Nothing special has been added, but just a reminder that if you live a distance away from Bay City, you can leave a guery on the Society's Facebook page, and you'll probably get a response.

Website (baymigensoc.com)

Items from the December 10, 1931, issue of the Bay City Times has been interspersed within the site's pages. In case you are wondering, the issue is selected randomly by the rolling of dice.

Between March 17, 2024, the date of the last report, and June 22, 2024, the day of this writing, there have been 177 visitors from twenty U. S. states (153), Russia (14), Philippines (3), Canada (2), United Kingdom (1), Poland (1), Australia (1), Turkey (1), Zimbabwe (1), and India (1).

Those visits from Russia came from Gatchina, Moscow, Nizhniy Novgorod, St. Petersburg, Yekaterinburg, and Voronezh. (While preparing the marriage records to be placed on the website, I occasionally find people who were born in Russia, and, maybe, through the website, they have been discovered by descendants of family members left behind when they came to America.)

Podcasts

While listening to my "Amazon Alexa", I heard a commercial for a podcast that can be heard via "Alexa." So, I looked to see if there are genealogy related podcasts that can be heard, for free, on "Alexa", and there are.

Here are a few:

Ancestrial Findings (Will Moneymaker)-Short podcasts that cover a specific genealogy topic.

Genealogy Guys (George Morgan and Drew Smith)-Report on genealogy conferences, books, news, research destinations, online resources.

Genealogy Gems (Lisa Louise Cooke)- Researching techniques and interviews with people from the world of genealogy.

Genealogy Happy Hour (Amy Crabill Lay and Penny Burke Bonawitz)- Helpful information for documenting family history.

Generations Café (Amy Johnson Crow)-Genealogy without the frustration.

To play podcasts on "Alexa", say, "Alexa, play [Title] podcast."

There is an excellent chance that these and other genealogy podcasts can be heard on other "Voice Services", such as "Google Assistant."
